Text: Mathematics: A Practical Odyssey, Fourth Edition, by Johnson and Mowry. Note that

this is a new edition of the text.

Coverage: Chapters 1 - 4 and 7.

Prerequisite: Alabama Minimum Mathematics Prerequisite.

Calculators: A basic scientific calculator is required for this course. Quiz and test questions will

be chosen under the assumption that you will be using a calculator with the required

capabilities.

Tutoring: The Department of Mathematics and Statistics provides free tutoring in ILB 456 be-

ginning the second week of classes. A schedule of hours for the tutoring lab will be

posted on the bulletin board outside ILB 325.

Grading: There will be two in-class tests, each counting as 25% of the course grade. The final

exam (Tuesday, May 1, 10:30 AM – 12:30 PM) will be cumulative, and will count as 35% of the course grade. The remaining 15% of the grade will be derived from weekly quizzes and homework assignments. There are no make-up tests or quizzes. If you miss a test and have a valid excuse, a grade for that test will be extrapolated from the part of the final exam which covers the missed test. Unless otherwise announced, the cut-off points for the letter grades A, B, C and D are 90%, 80%, 70% and 60%,

respectively.

Audit: If you are auditing the class, you will receive a grade of UA (unsatisfactory audit) if,
